4. EMOTIONAL INTELLIGENCE

- (a) Internal Emotional Intelligence Training, and Community Training
 - Members are looking for a series or courses that are ongoing education around El.
 - Members are also thinking about a lecture series or talking series on the topic of El. These could be in different locations around the town.
 - Review of the existing workshop hosted by Kentville and Carolyn Landry about the Seven Sacred Teachings. This class is going well.
 - The committee could have a working group that would think about hosts and ideas for these public sessions.
 - Idea of a living library to connect with people and their experiences and their stories.
 - Is there someone at Acadia University who has expertise on EI?
 - Comment that online learning is very difficult for learners who have English as a second language.

5. TRANSPORTATION

(a) Presentation from Director of Recreation Rachel Bedingfield

Rachel Bedingfield gave a review of Kentville's active transportation plan priorities, education, seasonal considerations, mapping of demographics.

- Comments about how the Town and other towns and cities are adapting to new transportation opportunities.
- The accessibility plan and active transportation are closely linked.

(b) Presentation from Chief Administrative Officer Dan Troke

Chief Administrative Officer Dan Troke gave a review of the Kings Transit pilot project and how it will influence transportation in the town in terms of planning for population growth, slopes, buses, new development areas and accessibility.

- Support for having the incoming Kings Transit manager liaise with the accessibility committee.
- Send information to Dan about bussing and transportation to make sure important gets into these conversations.
- Is there a plan to bring Uber or other ride sharing service to the valley? This can be a major support for some people with accessibility issues. This is an important topic to include in this transportation pilot.

6. TOWN HALL UPDATE

Rachel Bedingfield gave an update on town and staff activities around accessibility. The Town's training committee is taking on professional development as a staff with a focus on accessibility and inclusion, and also occupational health and safety. There is also a committee of management and key staff who meet to talk about the implementation of the accessibility committee and the active transportation committee. Other discussions have been happening among staff and other municipalities around the housing crisis in the valley. The Portal, Open Arms and many other groups have been working together to reduce homelessness. The town is always trying to find more tools, programs and devices to improve access, for example the Town purchased a Moby Mat to help wheelchairs access difficult terrain in some of the parks.

7. ACCESSIBILITY WEBSITE AND SOCIAL MEDIA (a) Rating Website

Jennifer West gave a tour of the AXS mapping website (https://axsmap.com/) and some potential for a mapping project for Kentville.

Discussion about how to roll out a project like this to leave a positive legacy for residents, visitors and businesses.

(b) Social Media Launch and Zoom Picture

Spencer discussed the potential of having a short time at the end of each meeting where we can read any feedback or requests about accessibility from the public. This section can be livestreamed to Facebook. This will rely on videos that explain what the committee does and how residents can reach out to accessibility@kentville.ca
